

Local Goings On Hyperbaric Chamber

The healing benefits of oxygen have long been understood. Major hospitals have pressurized oxygen chambers to treat various illnesses such as diabetes, bone necrosis, wound healing, alleviating discomfort in patients undergoing chemotherapy and radiotherapy, reducing bruises, post-surgical treatment, rehabilitation of acquired brain damage, ictus, sclerosis, fibromyalgia, spasticity, sports medicine and professional training.

Now, our own Punta Mita Hospital has a hyperbaric chamber available. At 1.45 atmospheres, and 80% oxygen level, it's a low risk way to heal. The high pressure chamber allows your red blood cells to carry a higher level of oxygen into your tissues, and stimulates growth hormone production and stem cell production. Appointments take an hour (45 minutes in the chamber) and are not expensive - they are running a special for \$4500 MXN for three appointments. How many appointments you need varies based on what you are trying to address. Dr Salazar who runs the clinic and monitors your progress would be happy to chat about what it could do for you. Take a good book as it's a great way to catch up on your reading list too.
